

**ANNUAL REPORT ON THE WORKING OF THE MOTOR TRANSPORT
WORKERS ACT, 1961 FOR THE YEAR 2016.**

The Motor Transport Workers Act 1961 came into force with effect from 01.12.1961. The provisions of the Motor Transport Workers Rules except Rule 17 to 23 and 25 came into force with effect from 01.08.1963.

The Labour Commissioner functions as the Chief Inspector under the Motor Transport Workers Act 1961. District Labour Officers (E) is functioning as Inspectors under the Motor Transport Workers Act. The enforcement work has been entrusted with the Assistant Labour Officer.

There were **7108** Motor Transport undertakings at the beginning of the year 2016. **1026** undertakings were newly registered and **60** undertakings have been removed from the register during the year. Thus at the end of the year 2016, the number of registered undertakings came up to **8074**. No undertakings are submitting return during the year 2016.

The Inspectors conducted inspections in **3102** undertakings during the year under report.

The main defects noticed at the time of inspection were non maintenance of registers and individual control book, non issuance of wage slips, delayed payment of wages, non payment of uniform allowance etc.

There were **329** prosecutions pending at the beginning of the year. **181** prosecution cases were filed during the year, **96** cases ended in conviction, **2** cases are acquitted and **412** cases were pending.

There are no Canteen and Rest rooms provided during the year 2016. In short the working of the Motor Transport Act and the Rules made there under was generally satisfactory in the state during the year 2016.
